

## SAFETY

- When drilling into brick work always wear safety goggles, a dust mask, and always work in a well ventilated area.
- Keep children clear of work area especially when assembling or moving the surround / mantle assembly.
- Always read the installer and owner guide supplied with the heater. This guide should be read in conjunction with those supplied with the heater.
- Always tidy loose electrical leads in the work area.
- Always switch off electric power when not needed.
- The surround must always be fixed into position.

### HANDLING AND UNPACKING

Before continuing any further with the installation of this mantle / surround and hearth please read the following:

#### **Important instructions.**

• The approximate lifting weights of the mantle / surround and hearth are as below:

Surround	17.5 kg.
Rear panel	5.5 kg.
Hearth	7.5 kg.

- One person should be sufficient to lift the hearth or mantle/ surround. If for any reason this weight is considered too heavy then obtain assistance.
- When lifting always keep your back straight. Bend your legs and not your back.
- Avoid twisting at the waist. It is better to reposition your feet.
- Avoid upper body / top heavy bending. Always bend from the knees rather than the waist. Do not lean forward or sideways whilst handling.
- Always grip with the palm of the hand. Do not use the tips of fingers for support.
- Always keep the Surround / Mantle and Hearth as close to the body as possible. This will minimise the cantilever action.
- Use gloves to provide additional grip.
- Always use assistance if required.




Figure 1. Contents (Items are not to scale. Any components extra to those above can be discarded).

## **ASSEMBLING THE SURROUND AND HEARTH**

The installation of this Surround / Mantle and Hearth requires a reasonable level of DIY skills.

Please read this guide thoroughly before commencing installation and if in doubt, seek help from a competent person

#### Do I need any tools?


You will need the following tools :

• A Pozidrive / Phillips / cross head screwdriver. This should have a number 2 size tip.

• If drilling into brick work you will need a power drill (preferably with hammer action) and appropriate size drill bit for the wall plugs supplied.

### How to assemble the Surround / Mantle and Hearth. Step 1

- Lay the legs (B) onto a smooth, flat, clean surface with the inside facing upward as shown in figure 2. Place fascia (A) as in figure 2. The rail screwed to the bottom of the fascia should be level with the side rails of the legs. The plastic blocks should be at the top of the surround.
- Secure using four (J) screws.





#### Step 2

- Locate the back panel (C) on top of the inner legs as in figure 3. The bottom of the back panel should be level with the bottom of the leg rails.
- Secure to the surround using 8 (J) screws.




- Carefully lift and stand the surround. We recommend that the surround is supported.
- Locate the surround top (D) on top of the surround as in figure 4. The top should be central. Ensure that the rear of the top is level with the rear of the surround.
- Secure in place using eight (K) screws through the plastic blocks.





#### Step 3

• Place wall fixing brackets (N) 50mm from the top outside edge of the legs as shown in figure 5. Ensure that the two fixing holes in the brackets are positioned in the centre of the outside edge of the leg. The surround may split if the fixing holes are not central. Secure in place using four screws (L).



#### Step 2


• Lay the hearth (E) on the floor. Stand the surround on top of the hearth.

Position the surround so that it is central to the hearth and the rear of the surround legs are flush with the back of the hearth.

• Secure the surround to the hearth using eight screws (K) through the holes in the wooden blocks (See figure 6).

#### Step 3

• Carefully move the whole assembly into place. Mark the positions of the bracket holes on the wall. Move the assembly aside and drill suitable sized holes. Insert the wall plugs (M). Position the whole assembly into position and secure using two screws (K).



Note: The wall plugs are only suitable for brick or block walls. For timber framed walls covered in plaster board we recommend the use of heavy duty cavity fixings.
